Abel Tasman

A European explorer from Holland, named Abel Tasman, sailed to New Zealand in 1642. When Tasman and his crew tried to land in New Zealand the Maori would not allow it and they had to sail down the coast.



Captain James Cook

In 1796, a British explorer named Captain James Cook landed in New Zealand. He was the first person to realise that New Zealand was made up of two large islands. He also drew a map of New Zealand which is very close to the one we use today.
