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Sacraments

New Classrooms

Senior Infants have now moved into the two new classrooms. These rooms are a fantastic addition to our wonderful school and the children are delighted to be there. As you have seen, further work was also carried out on the yard and we now have a lovely new play area replacing the former stop and drop. All of this work was carried out with the children's safety as our **priority** but of course came at an additional cost. and therefore, fundraising will be required to defray same. We hope to organise a large scale fundraising event this year.

New Stop and Drop

Our new Stop and Drop facility continues to be very successful and greatly enhances our school. This is largely due to your cooperation and for this we thank you. There are times however when a lack of consideration causes disruption and undue delays. Please remember that our primary concern is for your children's safety. Bearing that



in mind please consider the following points.

• It is imperative that everyone drives to the front door end of the facility before stopping in so far as possible. Your child should then use the railed pathway to walk back down and enter the school yard. For this system to be successful, we must allow it to flow and drivers must be conscious of the vehicles behind them waiting to enter the stop and drop. Please encourage your child to walk on the inside of the railing. •Please do not reverse into the stop and drop. It is extremely dangerous.

Please do not park your vehicle or leave it unattended at any time in the stop and drop.
For your childs safety, please ensure he/ she exits the car on the path side of the stop and drop. It is extremely dangerous to exit on the other side as cars will be overtaking and might not see a small child

• Please refrain from parking outside the stop and drop island as it is a public road and to park on same causes an obstruction. It is in everybody's interest that our new system continues to be a success and with your patience and courtesy this will be the reality.

Morning Supervision

It has come to my attention that a number of children are dropped at school at an early hour. I wish to remind parents that the school cannot accept responsibility for children before 9am. Children are supervised every morning from 9 to 9:20 to facilitate parents. It is in the child's own interest that parents leave once s/he is dropped off. This is important from a socialisation point of view and helps to foster independence.

2pm Collection Times

This year, we have a large number of infants being collected at 2pm. In order to ensure the <u>safety</u> of all children, we ask for your support with the following:

We would ask all parents to assemble outside the fence in the old stop and drop (new play area)

The children line up in the basketball court facing their parents. This ensures that both child and teacher have a clearer view of the adult col-

lecting them.

It is **important** that children remain in their line until the teacher gives each child into the parents care. We ask for your patience at this time. It is very important that everyone collecting children i.e crèche, grandparents, older siblings, neighbours is made aware of this system in order for it to run smoothly You will appreciate that it is impossible for any teacher to discuss a child at this time.

Also, please keep in mind that other classes are still ongoing so we would ask for your cooperation in leaving as soon as possible once you have collected your child, in order to keep noise levels to a minimum.

I hope you will accept in good faith all the above regulations for the welfare and safety of the children

3pm Collection

Children are supervised for 15 minutes each day at 3pm.We again ask for your patience and courtesy at this time. The whole process generally takes 10 to 15 minutes and our priority is always the children's safety. If you choose to collect your child at the roundabout below the school, it is important to understand that they are no longer on the school premises and therefore are not supervised. The BOM cannot accept responsibility for those children. It is important for parents to remember that there is a risk factor involved and this cannot be seen as good practice in the current climate.
