As you may already know, the government has confirmed that the Free Primary School Books Scheme will continue for the upcoming school year. This means that you do not need to purchase school books, workbooks or copybooks for your child. All materials provided under this scheme are on loan and must be returned to the school at the end of the academic year in good condition.

Please note that while core learning materials are covered under this scheme, there are still **school fees** due in September to cover the cost of:
