School Development

<u>Child Protection</u> Our BOM has completed the annual review of our Child Safeguarding Statement and it is available to view on our website or in the school office. Ms. Eimear Carroll is our Designated Liaison Person for Child Protection in our school. Please note that all staff members are mandated child protection officers. New Child Protection Procedures have just been updated and published. There will be whole staff training on November 14th. Schools shall adopt the updated procedures no later than their last meeting prior to 31 December 2026.

<u>Bĭ Cineálta Annual Review</u> The Board of Management of Lisnagry National School confirms that the board of management's annual review of the school's Bí Cineálta Policy to Prevent and Address Bullying Behaviour and its implementation was completed at the board of management meeting on 21st October 2025. This review was conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Department of Education's Bí Cineálta Procedures to Prevent and Address Bullying Behaviour for Primary and Post-Primary Schools.

Gaelbhratach We as a school are excited to begin our second year of being actively involved in the Gaelbhratach initiative. Gaelbhratach is a nationwide scheme that aims to provide opportunities to all pupils, to speak Gaeilge outside the formal classroom setting in natural and fun ways. Last year we worked hard to achieve our certificate status and this year we are focusing on achieving The Gaelbhratach Flag. To do this we will be implementing some fun incentives into our school life. We plan on using methodologies such as; cluichí teanga-language games, cluichí chlóis - yard games, seisiúin scéalaíochta - story time, scéim gcomhrádaithe - a buddy system, Gaeilge agus ábhar eile - teaching another subject through Gaeilge and Gaeilge lasmuigh den scoil - working with an outside agency to promote Gaeilge. Through all these incentives we hope to achieve The Gaelbhratach Flag. We look forward to sharing our good news with you all towards the end of the year-Le Cúnamh Dé – hopefully!

Wellness Improvement Plan As part of our Wellbeing Improvement Plan this year, we are focusing on two key areas: inclusion and pupil voice. We are delighted to share that our school has been chosen as a pilot school by the National Council for Special Education (NCSE) for their new pupil voice initiative, CREATE.

<u>Drop-Off and Collection Procedures</u> We kindly ask all parents and guardians to take great care during drop-off and collection times. Parking around any school can be challenging, especially on wet days, and safety remains our number one priority. We greatly appreciate your patience and courtesy in helping everything run smoothly.

To ensure the safe and efficient operation of our Stop and Drop facility, please take note of the following reminders:

- Always drive to the front door end of the Stop and Drop area before stopping, where possible.
- Children should enter and exit the school using the railed pathway provided.
- Do not park or leave your vehicle unattended in the Stop and Drop zone at any time.

We are very fortunate to have our Stop and Drop facility, along with a new pedestrian crossing and footpath outside the school — all designed with your child's safety as our primary concern.

Please ensure that children only cross the road at the pedestrian crossing outside the school gates. Crossing the main road or the small roundabout at any other point is extremely dangerous, particularly during busy drop-off and collection times.

We would also urge you to show courtesy to our neighbours and local residents by refraining from obstructing driveways or entrances to their properties. Your consideration helps maintain positive relationships within our community and ensures safe, respectful use of the surrounding area.

Together, let's continue to model and encourage safe and respectful behaviour by reminding every child to always use the designated crossing. Thank you for your ongoing cooperation and commitment to keeping all our pupils safe.
